2014 Junior Golf Program

The PGA Sports Academy

The Junior Golf Program starts with our after school junior clinics for ages 9-15 on May 16th and run each Friday until June 6th. The program will run from 3-4:30pm. Sign-ups are here in the Pro Shop or you can email Jake to enroll your children and/or grandchildren.

We are here to make sure new golfers are engaged and have a fun, interactive experience. To educate and get juniors involved in golf is the goal, but keeping it fun is the primary focus. Our instructors will enjoy the experience; juniors will sense the love of the sport and hopefully become golfers for a lifetime.

The PGA Sports Academy program is a collaborative framework based on research and best practices from PGA Professionals, PGA Education, allied associations and the Long Term Athlete Development (LTAD) standards for juniors, adopted by the PGA World Alliance. The PGA Sports Academy's focus is to develop core golfers and provide them with pathways to continue to play golf socially or competitively based on each individual's desire.

The PGA Sports Academy has three levels: Player, Sport and Champion.

Each level includes five focus areas that will help juniors learn, develop and practice the skills to become better golfers and enjoy the sport of golf:

- Fitness and Nutrition
- Golf Skills
- Sportsmanship, Etiquette and Rules
- Golf and Near-Golf Experiences
- Golf and Skills Challenges



Each level will develop the necessary physical and golf skills to practice, improve and enjoy the sport. Juniors will be tested before they begin each level to determine their level of experience. At the end of each level, each participant will be tested again and will receive a score based on his or her skill level.

Course Etiquette

- Each player must have a set of clubs and a golf bag.
- There should be no more than 2 bags and 2 riders per golf cart.
- Golf cart drivers, who rent carts, must be 16 years of age and possess a valid driver's license and provide it if requested.
- Non-riders will not be charged.
- Keep all carts 30 feet from the greens and on paths where provided. Avoid soft turf and wet low lying areas. Obey all cart signs.
- Repair all ball marks, yours and at least one other.
- Replace divots and use divot mix where provided.
- Rake bunkers after play and leave rake where originally found.
- Chipping and pitching are limited to a 30 foot radius around the putting green.
- No private coolers or ice chests. All food and beverages must be purchased from PHC. P.L.C.B. regulations prohibit open liquor bottles on club property.

Course Dress Code

Men:

- Slacks (no denim)
- Bermuda-style shorts
- Golf shirts with collars
- Turtle necks and mock-turtle necks
- Non-metal spikes
- The Pro Shop staff has been asked to provide any further guidance as deemed necessary.

Ladies:

- Skirts and Bermuda-style shorts (length of which should be no shorter than halfway between the mid-thigh and the knee)
- Collared sleeveless golf shirts
- Collarless golf shirts with sleeves
- Non-metal spikes
- The Pro Shop staff has been asked to provide any further guidance as deemed necessary.

2014 Golf Course Rules and Regulations

USGA Rules Govern All Play

All golf clubs shall conform to USGA specifications. There is a 14 club limit, it will be enforced for all tournaments and events.

Local Golf Rules

- Embedded ball rule is in effect through the green.
- Stones in bunkers are moveable obstructions.
- Staked and wired trees are immovable obstructions.
- Only measuring device that is permitted is to find distance.
- Optional ball drop #6-when a ball enters the (lateral) hazard, the player may drop a ball in the "ball drop" under penalty of one stroke. The procedure is an additional option under rule 26-water hazards.



Pro Shop Credit and Prizes

Prizes for most PHC events will be awarded in Pro Shop Credit or Gift Certificates. Credit and Certificates are redeemable only in the PHC Pro Shop. Credit may not be transferred between accounts. Credit earned, must be used by the end of the 2014 golf season.

The Hole in One Club

- An initial cost of \$10 provides each golfer with Hole in One Insurance.
- The golfer who makes an "ace" will be insured for the price of one drink to each member of the hole in one club that is present that day. Golfer also receives \$100 in Pro Shop credit.
- Current roster and account balances are posted in the locker rooms.
- When the fund drops to 50 percent of the original amount, each member of The Hole in One Club will be charged \$5 to replenish the fund. Sign-up in the Pro Shop.

Tee Off Rules

Please reserve tee time by: calling the pro shop or emailing the pro shop. Players with tee times are assured that their reservation will be honored. Those players who have not reserved tee times will enter the schedule as openings permit. Although it is advised that all players reserve a tee time, failure to do so does not deny those players the opportunity to play. Members who store their clubs are asked to alert pro shop staff so their clubs will be in the staging area when they arrive.

Priority on the Course

In the absence of special rules, priority on the course will be in the following order: Foursomes, Threesomes, Twosomes and Singles. Groups of three or less could experience some delay.

During high traffic periods, the Pro Shop is authorized to match up groups of three or less to best utilize the course in order to accommodate all golfers.

Handicaps

Golf handicap indexes are maintained through the Pro Shop. Posting will begin April 7th and will be updated thirteen times throughout the season until October 1st. To maintain an accurate index, golfers must enter their adjusted score after each round of golf. Proper posting procedures will be posted in the Pro Shop along with the events that constitute tournament score. Each adult golf member will be charged \$35 to maintain a USGA handicap index, the non member cost is \$45. This fee includes membership in the Western Pennsylvania Golf Association as well as tournament/event programs and permits golfers to participate in club events.

Pace of Play

The Pennhills Club Golf Course pace of play is approximately four hours.

The USGA pace of play rating is 3 hours and 57 minutes of total time.

An undelayed round of golf is an important tradition of PHC. Your place on the course is directly behind the group in front of you, not directly ahead of the group behind you. Play without delay. Whenever a match shall for any reason fall more than one clear hole behind players ahead, it is expected to invite the following match to play through.

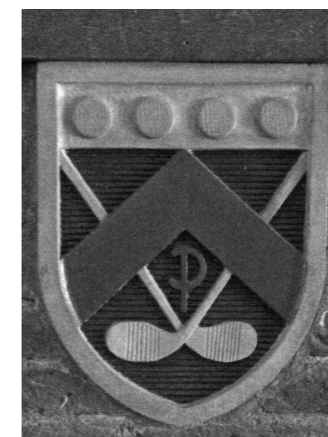
Golf League Schedules

The nine holes that are designated for league play each week are closed for member play that evening. Only the league will play these nine holes, all other golfers will play the other nine holes.

- League Front-Holes 2-10
- League Back-Holes 1, 11-18

Hole number one is not to be played as a practice hole on the way to holes 2-10 regardless if there are no players on the first tee. If in doubt, check with the Pro Shop, your cooperation is necessary.

- Men's League plays 9 holes on Tuesday. Start times are between 4 pm and 6 pm.
- Ladies' League plays 9 holes on Wednesday. Start times are between 4 pm and 6 pm.
- M.G.A. plays 18 holes on Thursday. The events are 1 pm shotgun starts. Members not participating are required to finish play by noon.



Inclement Weather

In the event of inclement weather or frost delays, the order of play will be determined by the PGA Golf Professional or Course Superintendent.

The PGA Golf Professional or Course Superintendent reserve the right to suspend or cancel any event or play due to inclement weather or life threatening conditions.

Discontinue Play : 1 prolonged note of siren

Resumption of Play: 2 short notes of siren

Guest Rules

- All guests must check in at the Pro Shop before play and pay all appropriate fees.
- All guests must be accompanied by or sponsored by a member in good standing to be entitled to play.
- The sponsoring member will be responsible for all fees or charges incurred by their guests or any damages to PHC property caused by their guest.
- Members are responsible for advising their guests of PHC policies and dress code.
